BEFORE YOU BEGIN



You'll only need one simple tool: A small dry-erase board you can hold on your lap.



Keep each lesson short—no more than 5 minutes—and make sure your child's attention is fully on you.

5 MINUTES A DAY TO READING SUCCESS!

STEP I—LEARN THE SOUNDS



Teach one sound a day—short and sweet!

Day 1

Write a lowercase 'a' on your whiteboard.

Say to your child:

"This is 'a.' Can you say 'a'?" (Listen to the audio sample to hear

how to say this.)

If your child repeats it correctly, you're done for today!

Day 2

Review the sound of 'a' from yesterday.

If your child remembers it easily, introduce the sound of 'b.'

Write 'b' on your whiteboard and say:

"This is 'b.' Can you say 'b'?"

When your child says the sound back to you, give a quick smile or high-five—and end the lesson!

Day 3 and Beyond

Introduce one new letter sound each day, always reviewing the previous ones first. Repeat until you've finished the alphabet.

You'll notice that your child begins to recognize sounds instantly—no hesitation or guessing. That's when true learning is happening!



- Pronounce each sound correctly. If you're unsure how to say a sound, ask your child's teacher or choose a phonics program with an audio component.
- Keep lessons short. Just one or two minutes a day builds the habit.
- Celebrate your child. Every mastered sound is a step toward reading real words!

step I GOAL: Your child should be able to say the sound for every letter without needing to think. Don't rush. Stay on one sound until your child can recall it easily, then move on to the next.

MOVE ON \Rightarrow

Once your child can recall all the sounds instantly, you're ready for Step 2! (next page).

STEP 2—COMBINE THE SOUNDS



Now your child will start blending letters into real words!

Day 1: The First Word

cat Write the letters 'c – a - t' on your whiteboard. Point to each letter and ask your child to say the sound. Move your finger a little faster, again asking your child to say the sound of each letter.

When your child hears 'cat' in their own voice, celebrate! Your child has learned to read with phonics!

Day 2: Try a New Word

Repeat the Day 1 lesson with the word 'dog.'

Day 3 and Beyond

Repeat the Day 1 lesson with more short words, such as pin, rug, and map.

Once your child can blend three-letter words smoothly, you've completed the first 2 steps of Teach Your Child to Read. You taught your child to read, and they loved it!
